Emmy for The Office episode 'Gay Witch Hunt', and has also won Emmys for his work on The Simpsons, King of the Hill and Saturday Night Live, and was nominated for a Writers Guild Award for his Seinfeld episode 'The Parking Space'.



FARAH ABUSHWESHA is a writer, producer and founder of the BAFTA Rocliffe New Writing Forums. She writes the popular blog Farah's Rocliffe Notes. She has worked in

film production for many years, forthcoming productions include Pressure with Danny Huston and Matthew Goode and Suite Française with Michelle Williams and Kristen Scott Thomas. 

Tony Cooke (aged 35) is a comedy writer from London and lives in Enfield. He studied Geography at Nottingham University and did a postgraduate course in Journalism at Cardiff
