<p><b>A Real Summer</b> BBC Two/BBC/10.11.07</p> <p>Set in 1958, A Real Summer follows Mary (Ruth Wilson), a brilliant young writer and critic who is befriended by Geraldine (also Ruth Wilson), a young debutante of a similar age but from a very different background. What starts as friendship becomes something more unsettling.</p>
<p><b>A Room With A View</b> ITV1/IWC Media, part of the RDF Media Group/04.11.07</p> <p>A new interpretation by Andrew Davies of EM Forster's classic novel. When Lucy Honeychurch visits Florence in search of adventure, she finds herself drawn to a handsome fellow traveller. This new adaptation of the novel is framed poignantly by Lucy Honeychurch's nostalgic return to Florence after the First World War.</p>
<p><b>Ballet Shoes</b> BBC One/Granada Productions/26.12.07</p> <p>Orphans Pauline, Petrova and Posy Fossil are adopted by eccentric explorer Professor Matthew Brown "Gum" and raised as sisters by his selfless niece Sylvia. When "Gum" goes missing, Sylvia makes ends meet by taking in lodgers whose actions change their lives forever.</p>
<p><b>Boy A</b> C4/Cuba Pictures /26.11.07</p> <p>Based on the novel by Jonathan Trigell, 'Boy A' is a powerful coming-of-age drama that raises difficult questions about the morals of our times. Starring Andrew Garfield and Peter Mullan, 'Boy A' is a fictional story about Jack (Garfield) a young man who has spent most of his life in institutions paying for a terrible crime he committed as a minor.</p>
<p><b>Capturing Mary</b> BBC Two/A Talkback Thames Production for BBC Films and HBO/12.12.07</p> <p>Capturing Mary creates a terrifying, compulsive story of lost youth. Maggie Smith who plays the older Mary, knocks unannounced on the door of a grand house. Meeting the teenage concierge, Joe, she enters and hesitantly relives her past.</p>
<p><b>Coming Down the Mountain</b> BBC One/Tiger Aspect/02.09.07</p> <p>When teenager David's family move to the back of beyond for the sake of his brother, Ben, who has Down Syndrome, David's antipathy towards Ben grows and grows – to the point where he decides to push him off a mountain to get rid of him for once and for all...</p>
<p><b>Consent</b> C4/Century Films/21.01.07</p> <p>When Becky (Anna Madeley) and Steve (Danny Mays) attend a client party and end up kissing in a hotel room, no-one but them knows what happens next. When she approaches the police to accuse him of rape, the fates of both are handed over to a real-life jury, shedding light for the first time on what happens behind the doors of the jury room.</p>

<p><b>Forgiven</b> C4/Betty/16.08.07</p> <p>A challenging factual drama about the uncomfortable subject of child abuse. A convincing portrait of a middle-class family dealing with the unimaginable horror of discovering a father who has been abusing his own daughter. With performances of quite awesome range and intensity, Forgiven successfully tells a story that challenges our preconceptions – not only about child abuse, but about love and marriage.</p>
<p><b>George Gently</b> BBC One/Company Television/08.04.07</p> <p>It's 1964, and the world is changing fast.....When Commander George Gently's beloved wife is murdered, he suspects his nemesis, the gangster Joe Webster, is responsible. Gently follows Webster to Northumberland where he and his new young sidekick John Bacchus race to find him before he kills again.</p>
<p><b>Good Samaritan, The</b> ITV1/ITV Productions/16.05.07</p> <p>When Brian Guest (Shane Richie) wrongly receives a phone call from a man threatening to jump from a rooftop his life spirals out of control. Believing that his unhelpful response has resulted in the man's death, Brian sets out to make amends to the man's wife, regardless of the cost.</p>
<p><b>Half Broken Things</b> ITV1/Festival Film &amp; TV/28.10.07</p> <p>A lonely house-sitter facing imminent retirement falls in love with the country house she's looking after. When she takes in two strangers, she discovers the family she never had but as their idyllic fantasy begins to crumble, the family must decide how far they're willing to go to protect their perfect life.</p>
<p><b>History of Mr Polly, The</b> ITV1/ITV Productions/07.05.07</p> <p>We first meet our hero, 37-year-old Alfred Polly at his lowest ebb. Via flashbacks to his childhood, it unfolds that Polly has always been a dreamer. As a single man, he struggles to hold down his retail apprenticeship. The unexpected death of his father leaves him some money, enabling Polly to start anew. Fast forward 15 years, and we rejoin the world-weary Polly that we met at the start.</p>
<p><b>It's A Free World</b> C4/Sixteen Films/24.09.07</p> <p>The latest collaboration from director Ken Loach, writer Paul Laverty and producer Rebecca O'Brien, is a drama rooted in the world of illegal employment in contemporary Britain. The single drama stars newcomers Kierston Wareing and Juliet Ellis. Angie (Wareing) may not have much formal education but she's got energy, wit and ambition, and she's in her prime. They set up a recruitment agency for immigrant workers which operates in a twilight world where labour is cheap and laws are made to be ignored.</p>
<p><b>Joe's Palace</b> BBC One/A TalkbackThames production for BBC Films and HBO/04.12.07</p> <p>Joe's Palace charts the relationship between Elliot, a reclusive billionaire, and Joe, who looks after Elliot's grand, empty house. Elliot cannot bring himself to live in the house he has inherited, haunted by memories of his mysterious father.</p>

<p><b>Mansfield Park</b> ITV1/Company Pictures/18.03.07</p> <p>Fanny Price is taken from her impoverished childhood home to live with her rich cousins at Mansfield Park, but is never allowed to forget her roots. While Fanny's uncle is absent in Antigua, Mary Crawford and her brother Henry arrive in the neighbourhood, bringing with them the recklessness of London society.</p>
<p><b>Mark of Cain, The</b> C4/Red Production Company/12.04.07</p> <p>Life-long friends Shane Gulliver and Mark 'Treacle' Tate are on their first tour of duty with the British Army in Basra in 2003. The rules of engagement as peace-keeping troops force them into complex situations they'd never anticipated, leaving them forced to re-examine their actions...., with profound consequences.</p>
<p><b>Maxwell</b> BBC Two/BBC Specialist Factual/01.01.07</p> <p>Maxwell is a one-off special for BBC Two that tells the story of the dramatic stages of Robert Maxwell's life. It's a gripping account of how greed and ambition destroyed a man and led him to commit one of the world's biggest ever frauds.</p>
<p><b>Miss Marie Lloyd – Queen of the Music Hall</b> BBC Four/BBC Drama Production/Hat Trick Productions/09.05.07</p> <p>A rags-to-riches costume drama inspired by the life and loves of London's East End Music Hall legend, Marie Lloyd.</p>
<p><b>Murder in the Outback</b> ITV1/ITV Productions/09.04.07</p> <p>This is the factual drama of the British backpacker Peter Falconio's murder and his girlfriend Joanne Lees' attempted abduction. This film explores the traumatic ordeal Joanne Lees faced, first in the outback, and then at the hands of the world's press and the extraordinary battle to put a killer behind bars.</p>
<p><b>My Boy Jack</b> ITV1/Ecosse Films/11.11.07</p> <p><i>My Boy Jack</i> is the true story of Jack Kipling, who was refused entry into the army during WW1 because of his terrible eyesight. His father, Rudyard, the acclaimed author, used his influence to gain 17-year-old Jack a commission, but begins a frantic search for him when he goes missing in battle.</p>
<p><b>Northanger Abbey</b> ITV1/ITV Productions/25.03.07</p> <p>Catherine Morland is taken to Bath for the season where she makes the acquaintance of the Thorpe family. Catherine's head is turned by Henry Tilney and she is invited to Northanger Abbey, the home of the Tilneys. Catherine and Henry become close until Catherine imagines a mystery surrounding the death of the General's wife which offends Henry.</p>
<p><b>Old Curiosity Shop, The</b> ITV1/Carnival Film &amp; Television/26.12.07</p> <p>An adaptation of the Dickens classic which tells the story of beautiful Nell Trent and her gambling grandfather who are forced to flee to the country in order to escape loan shark Quilp's financial demands. But whilst Quilp's vengeful net closes and a mysterious stranger joins the hunt for the fugitives, it's ultimately Nell's declining health coupled with Grandfather's consuming addiction which together prove to be their greatest threat.</p>

**Persuasion**

ITV1/Clerkenwell Films/01.04.07

A new adaptation of Jane Austen's novel. At the age of nineteen Anne Elliot (Sally Hawkins) was persuaded by her family to break off her engagement with Frederick Wentworth (Rupert Penry-Jones), a decision she has always regretted. Now, eight years later, she is given a second chance to make things right. A classic story of longing, regret and undying love.

**Recovery**

BBC One/Tiger Aspect/25.02.07

Alan & Tricia Hamilton are blissfully happy, but their perfect life is torn apart when Alan steps in front of a passing car. The accident leaves Alan in a deep coma. Tricia is delighted when he awakes – only to discover that the man she loved may have disappeared forever.

**Saddam's Tribe**

C4/World Productions/10.05.07

In 1995, the bitter rivalry between Saddam Hussein's son and son-in-law approached crisis point. Caught in the middle was Saddam's daughter whose loyalties were tested as the battle for control of Iraq reached its bloody climax. From pampered politician's wife to exile, she would emerge as the fallen leader's heir.

**Secret Life**

C4/A Kudos Film and Television/19.04.07

The drama charts the story of Charlie (Matthew Macfadyen) who is white, in his early thirties, middle class and a child sex offender who has served his prison sentence but who, by his own admission, continues to pose a significant danger to children. When the rehabilitation centre he has elected to attend is shut down he is cast adrift in the local community.

**Stuart: A Life Backwards**

BBC One/Neal Street Productions/HBO/BBC Wales/23.09.07

When writer Alexander Masters asks homeless man, Stuart Shorter if he can write his story, Stuart advises him to tell it backwards, so it's " more exciting – like a Tom Clancy mystery". As Stuart recounts his life story in reverse, Alexander begins to understand how his life spiralled so badly out of control.

**Trial of Tony Blair, The**

More 4/Daybreak Pictures/15.01.07

Tony departs Downing Street and converts to Catholicism. With Washington's warmongers discredited, he finds himself increasingly isolated. Haunted by the continuing nightmare of Iraq, and obsessed by his legacy, he retreats into denial, refusing to see the dangers he faces from the Special Tribunal on Iraq that has been set up to investigate war crimes.

**Wind In the Willows, The**

BBC1/Box TV/DCD Media/01.01.07

Live action adaptation of the classic, starring Matt Lucas and Bob Hoskins. Timid mole leaves his hole and meets Ratty, Badger and exuberant Mr. Toad. Toad's fast car makes him a menace to society and soon lands him in serious trouble. But nobody thwarts amazing Mr Toad for long!

**Yellow House**

C4/Talkback Thames/23.03.07

For two months in 1888 an ambitious, youngish artist was persuaded by his avant-garde Paris agent to go & stay in the South of France with the agent's younger brother, an aspiring artist. Certain of his own self importance, Gauguin arrived in Arles to move in with his new pupil, Van Gogh. Within 2 months, the pair fell out, never to meet again.

**You Can Choose Your Friends**

ITV1/Avalon Television/07.06.07

*You Can Choose Your Friends* is a new 90-min comedy-drama which re-unites Anton Rodgers and Julia McKenzie two decades after *Fresh Fields* and *French Fields*. Written by Richard Herring, this warm and witty, yet edgy and distinctive script also features Robert Daws, Claire Skinner and Rebecca Front.

<p><b>Drama Series</b> A drama of more than one episode where stand-alone story lines conclude within each episode</p>
<p><b>Chase, The</b> BBC One/Rollem Productions Co. Ltd/08.07.07</p> <p>The Chase is a veterinary practice in the Yorkshire town of Oxley. When their father George is killed in a car crash, sisters Anna and Sarah must deal with a money-grabbing stepmother, their own tangled relationships and the suspicion that George was murdered, whilst keeping the family business afloat.</p>
<p><b>Doc Martin</b> ITV1/Buffalo Pictures/05.11.07</p> <p>The build-up of the last 3 series results in this episode's comedy of errors. Doc Martin &amp; Louisa have finally agreed to get married although as usual, many obstacles stand in their way. Having got through various mishaps during the day, the Doc and Louisa just make it in time to jilt each other at the altar.</p>
<p><b>Doctor Who</b> BBC One/BBC Wales/25.12.07</p> <p>The third series sees the Doctor meeting a new travelling companion, a young trainee Doctor named Martha Jones. Together they explore the past and future, and, as always, wherever the Doctor goes, enemies are never far behind – including the terrifying Daleks. When disaster hits the Titanic, the Doctor – ably assisted by the ship's waitress Astrid – battles aliens, saboteurs and robot angels.</p>
<p><b>Hustle</b> BBC One/Kudos Film and Television/03.05.07</p> <p>Hustle follows the fortunes of a gang of five expert con artists. In series four, when the team loses Mickey Bricks to an overseas sabbatical, it's time for someone else to lead the gang. When Danny steps up to the plate, can the others convince him that the team needs another member – especially when it comes in the form of street kid Billy Bond?</p>
<p><b>Judge John Deed</b> BBC One/One-Eyed Dog/09.01.07</p> <p>Mr Justice Deed is in The Hague hearing a case of a young British Soldier who killed eleven Iraqi civilians and who is now accused of war crimes. Deed's ruling on the case of a BNP councillor back in the UK has brought him to the attention of Muslim extremists. They blackmail Dr Fran Pavely to kill Deed.</p>
<p><b>Kingdom</b> ITV1/Parallel Film &amp; Television Productions Ltd/13.05.07</p> <p>Stephen Fry plays Peter Kingdom. A compassionate solicitor in a Norfolk Market town. His practice is supported by loyal secretary (Celia Imrie) and upstart trainee (Karl Davies). Peter spends most of his time solving the problems of quirky locals, whilst attempting to contain his sister's (Hermione Norris) love life and navigating the oddities of his unusual family.</p>
<p><b>Lewis</b> ITV1/ITV Productions/04.03.07</p> <p>DI Lewis and DS Hathaway are in Oxford solving the mystery of the suicide of Rachel Mallory.</p>

<p><b>Life on Mars</b> BBC One/Kudos Film and Television/BBC Wales/13.02.07</p> <p>A one-to-one meeting between Sam and Morgan turns Sam's world upside down. All Sam has to do, Morgan promises, is one more job and he can 'come home'. Sam's presumptions about his past, future and his very soul unravel in a heart-stopping climax.</p>
<p><b>Lilies</b> BBC One/World Productions/12.01.07</p> <p>Lilies depicts the sensual, vivid and sometimes savage working class world of the three Moss sisters, Iris, May and Ruby, coming of age in Liverpool in 1920, just after the First World War. The three (Catholic) girls all taste passion for the first time and their lives are changed forever.</p>
<p><b>New Street Law</b> BBC One/Red Production Company in assoc with One Eyed Dog/ 13.06.07</p> <p>Set in two rival barristers' chambers in the heart of Manchester, New Street Law is a fast-paced and contemporary drama following the week-by-week crises facing opposing legal teams and the people whose lives they hold in their hands.</p>
<p><b>Primeval</b> ITV1/Impossible Pictures/10.02.07</p> <p>Primeval is firmly set in the modern world with the notion of confronting our fragile contemporary civilization with creatures from the deep, mysterious past. Its astonishing visual effects are coupled with an exciting and compelling human story - one with all kinds of emotions, as each of our principal characters has a long journey to go on in the face of unimaginable crisis...</p>
<p><b>Rebus</b> ITV1/SMG Productions/05.10.07</p> <p>Crime drama Rebus is based on Ian Rankin's best-selling novels. In this episode, an act of insubordination sees Rebus back at Police College on an occupational behaviour course. We soon discover an ulterior motive behind his action - uncovering the crimes of two deeply corrupt officers on behalf of the top brass.</p>
<p><b>Robin Hood</b> BBC One/Tiger Aspect Productions/15.12.07</p> <p>Robin Hood returns to stop the Sheriff's devastating new campaign against King Richard, Marian seems to be turning to Gisborne, and there is a traitor within Robin's gang who is set on thwarting their missions. The hero steps forward.</p>
<p><b>Rome</b> BBC Two/HBO/20.06.07</p> <p>Season two opens in the aftermath of Caesar's brutal murder. His bloody death triggers a devastating battle for control of the Empire. Will it be his killer Brutus, Marc Antony or his precocious nephew Octavian who ultimately triumphs?</p>

**Shameless**

C4/Company Pictures/23.01.07

Created by Paul Abbott, Shameless tells the story of a group of siblings abandoned by their parents surviving by their wits and humour on a rough Manchester council estate. Series four sees the kids' lives turned upside down with the return of mother Monica, who has her eye firmly set on Frank.

**Skins**

E4/Company Pictures/25.01.07

Skins is an off-beat comedy drama series about a group of 16-17 year old friends. Sunny, optimistic kids who grab life by the balls and give it a twirl. Kids who party hard, pass exams, have sex, self-harm, manage their parents, interface with their teachers and push boundaries.

**Street, The**

BBC1/Granada Productions/08.11.07

Joe Jennerson envies his identical twin brother Harry. One evening as the brothers watch a football match on television, Harry chokes on a sweet and loses consciousness. Joe swaps clothes with Harry and takes on his identity.

**Torchwood**

BBC Three/BBC Wales/01.01.07

Torchwood follows the adventures of a team of investigators. Set in the UK in the present day, the team use scavenged alien technology in a very real world to solve crime - both alien and human. Separate from the government. Outside the Police. Beyond the United Nations.

**Whistleblowers, The**

ITV1/Carnival Film & Television/01.11.07

A new six-part series of conspiracy thrillers that uncovers government and corporate corruption, created by Tony Marchant. In episode 6, Ben and Alisha are drawn into a complex and controversial environmental thriller, where cost cutting at a privately-run waste incinerator plant threatens lives.

<p><b>Drama Serial</b> A drama of more than one episode where the story and characters develop throughout the series, rather than concluding at the end of each episode.</p>
<p><b>Bonkers</b> ITV1/Lime Pictures/08.03.07</p> <p>Vibrant, pacey and packed with plot, Bonkers is a saucy comedy drama set in suburbia which lifts the lids on the lives of an ensemble of colourful, flawed and desperate human beings, who are either obsessed with sex or just quietly going mad.</p>
<p><b>Britz</b> C4/Daybreak Pictures/31.10.07</p> <p>Britz is a story in two acts. Sohail and Nasima are a brother and sister born and bred in Bradford, whose constantly overlapping lives end up taking perilously different paths. The first film tells Sohail's story and the second Nasima's. From two differing points of view, we watch their hopes and ideals clash with the reality of being a young Muslim in Britain today.</p>
<p><b>The Commander: Windows of the Soul</b> ITV1/La Plante Productions/05.08.07</p> <p>On an East London estate, with a history of bad blood between residents and the police, a priest is brutally beaten and stabbed to death. Suspicion falls on Jimmy Bannerman, a talented fighter from the local boxing club. Following a vicious attack on a fellow detective, Commander Clare Blake and SCI Doug James are forced to put aside their differences and find the killer before he strikes again.</p>
<p><b>Cranford</b> BBC One/BBC Drama Productions/WGBH Boston in association with Chestermead Ltd/18.11.07</p> <p>Set in 1842, Cranford is a small Cheshire town on the cusp of great change as social reform and the railway line approach. This is a complex portrait of the inhabitants; their small absurdities, their major tragedies. Death and unexpected reversals, both happy and sad, come frequently.</p>
<p><b>Diary of a Nobody</b> BBC Four/Clerkenwell Films/24.04.07</p> <p>An adaptation of George and Weedon Grossmith's comic masterpiece by Andrew Davies. A comedy of Victorian manners in which Hugh Bonneville plays Charles Pooter, one of the most endearing characters in British Fiction. A series of monologues delivered straight to camera capture the comedy and poignancy of Pooter's voice and his own inimitable aptitude for putting his foot in it.</p>
<p><b>Drop Dead Gorgeous</b> BBC Three/Hat Trick Productions/21.10.07</p> <p>The central premise of an ordinary working class schoolgirl getting spotted and becoming famous is of course a story that would initially appeal to most people in this age group, (16-24), but it is the show's capacity to emotionally engage its audience that means the show lives long in the memory and attracts a large loyal following.</p>
<p><b>Fanny Hill</b> BBC Four/Sally Head Productions/22.10.07</p> <p>Set in the 18<sup>th</sup> Century, a young and innocent country girl Fanny Hill is orphaned. She goes to London and despite a near brush with prostitution is initially rescued by the love of a young man. However, events take a brutal turn and Fanny is required to live on her wits – and sexuality – to survive.</p>

<p><b>Drama Serial cont...</b> A drama of more than one episode where the story and characters develop throughout the series, rather than concluding at the end of each episode.</p>
<p><b>Five Days</b> BBC One/BBC Drama Production/HBO/23.01.07</p> <p>One hot summer day a young mother and her children inexplicably vanish. During five separate days of the subsequent investigation and under intense scrutiny from the press, pressures build on her family and on the police to find out what happened.</p>
<p><b>Instinct</b> ITV1/Tightrope/26.02.07</p> <p>A serial killer is stalking the streets of the Lancashire Pennines. In each victim's left hand, the date of their murder. The manner of death growing more macabre. The man in charge of the investigation, DCI Thomas Stone - a watcher, no time for social chit chat - pits his wit against that of the killer's.</p>
<p><b>Jekyll</b> BBC One/Hartwood Films/30.06.07</p> <p>Part comedy, part thriller; written by Steven Moffat – Jekyll is a contemporary continuation of the classic story. Desperate to protect his wife and children from his dark side, Dr Jackman has been forced to leave his old life behind and strike a diabolical deal with his own devil.</p>
<p><b>Life Line</b> BBC One/Carnival Film &amp; Television/24.04.07</p> <p>A supernatural and thrilling love story by Stephen Gallagher. After fifteen years abroad, Peter Brisco (Ray Stevenson) comes home to a chance encounter with his one true love Katy Adair. (Joanne Whalley). This ignites a whirlwind romance but tragedy strikes when Katy is killed. Peter seeks solace on Life Line, a mysterious chat line for the bereaved, which leads him to Catt (Jemima Rooper)</p>
<p><b>Miss Marple</b> ITV1/ITV Productions/23.09.07</p> <p>Miss Marple revisits the glamorous Bertram's Hotel in the heart of London where she observes the other guests, many of whom have gathered for the will reading of Sir Richard Blake. Tensions grow as jewel thieves, art dealers and Nazi hunters are revealed to be among the guests.</p>
<p><b>Mobile</b> ITV1/ITV Productions/26.03.06</p> <p>A conspiracy thriller which unfolds against the backdrop of the Iraq war and the multi-billion pound mobile phone industry, flashing back and forth to retrace events from three very different perspectives: the engineer, Eddie Doig (Neil Fitzmaurice) the soldier, Maurice Stoen (Jamie Draven), and the boss, James Corson (Keith Allen).</p>
<p><b>Murphy's Law</b> BBC One/Tiger Aspect Productions/01.10.07</p> <p>Following the mysterious disappearance of two undercover officers, Murphy is forced back into the field to find and follow their trail. He enters a world of human trafficking, befriending a vicious criminal ring of sex traders and putting himself at their disposal.</p>
<p><b>Nearly Famous</b> E4/Kudos Film and Television/12.11.07</p> <p>Nearly Famous follows a group of performing arts students who've got talent and a load of angst that make the average teenager's life seem easy. The difference is they've earned a place at a top London college for performing arts and have just one chance to prove they've got what it takes to make it.</p>

**Oliver Twist**

BBC One/BBC Drama Productions/WGBH Boston/18.12.07
