

masterclass with director Mike Newell on the relationship between the director and the screenplay, 'Re-writing The Rules' in which screenwriters discussed genre, audience and the creative process and 'Will You Read My Script?' where influential execs discussed the best ways to get a script into development.




Charlie Kaufman: Screenwriters Lecture Series

He also
